## From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Church Family,

As I type, I am struggling to fathom that one third of 2023 has already happened. We are on the cusp of Spring, of Eastertide, and of another month will fly by. May we all find the grace and patience to rest and enjoy our time together.

This year, Holy Week occupies the first week of April. This Sunday we call Palm Sunday, but we will have more happening in the service than that. We will gather in the courtyard and process in with our palms as we imagine Jesus entering Jerusalem for the last time. Then we will share Communion, which is our monthly ritual, but this time it also marks Jesus sharing the supper with his loved ones. Since we are following the timeline of events in Jesus' life, Communion will come in the middle of the service and then we will move to a reading of Jesus' trial and crucifixion.

On Maundy Thursday, we will gather for a Tenebrae service, which is another tradition handed down across centuries, as we commemorate Jesus' last night on earth. This is one of my favorite services of the year. So that those we are not comfortable driving after dark can attend, we will begin at 6:30 p.m.

Easter Sunday promises some wonderful music for our Bell Choir and a chance to celebrate the Resurrection together. These are the stories at the heart of our faith. I hope you will plan to be here so we can tell them to each other once again.

On April 23<sup>rd</sup> we will have our annual meeting. This year, we will do it over lunch in the Fellowship Hall. We are really good at eating and talking together, so it seemed like a natural thing to do.

By that time, I will be writing to tell you that April has flown by, which it will. The great theologian Ferris Bueller said, "Life moves pretty fast; if you don't stop and look around once in a while, you could miss it." May we take time—no, make time for one another, to look around and notice the gift of our congregation, and to continue to create a place of belonging here at Mount Carmel.

**Pastoral Support.** If you require pastoral support or guidance, please contact the office and our office administrator will put you in contact with someone who can help.




