My Church, My Faith, And Covid

I grew up in the Mount Carmel Congregational Church. I started going when I was 2 years old. The whole family went every Sunday. The family included my Grandparents, Mother, Father, older brother and eventually my younger brother. It is my understanding that my grandfather helped build the parish house so the kids would have a place to have a Sunday School. His hearing was going and having over 50 kids in the church was too noisy. I was baptized and confirmed and in between we went to church every Sunday. We would go to church even if we were away on vacation because we received a pin and then bars each year of perfect attendance. Church has always been an integral part of my life.

I don't remember Rev. Peters very well because I was so young. But I grew up with Rev. Jordon. I went to confirmation classes and we had a youth group that he ran. I was also married by Rev. Jordon as one of his last acts before retiring and Rev. House entering the family. Yes, I say family because I consider the church and its congregation as my family. It has been the only true constant in my life. My church family has carried me through the passing of many family members as well as several medical scares. One being my husband's aortic dissection. For several weeks we didn't know if he would survive. The church and my church family have been my rock throughout my life. It was always the place I would go to when times were tough.

Then Covid hit!! At first, I felt very disconnected. I was a deacon at the time and we were facing a double whammy, Rev. House was retiring and my precious church was closing down due to covid. I felt so lost, my job was getting more and more stressful and for the first time in my life I felt alone. (I do the reporting for the Virology Lab at Yale and we run most of the covid tests for this end of the state.) I used to stop at the church on my way home and either sit on the front steps or just put my hand on the church trying to make a connection. I prayed a lot but it felt like the

connection was lost. Eventually I stepped back from being a deacon. I was too stressed to be any help to my precious church. Then a glimmer of hope. We were able to have the services on line.

My husband is healthy but has a lot of underlying conditions. I have to be very careful and it has been very isolating for both of us. I still go to work but avoid gatherings. I haven't physically been to church in a long time but with the on-line services my connection has returned. I still stop and sit or touch my precious church but I feel almost whole. I hope someday to be together in person with my church family. I just want to thank all of you for being there for me and to let you know that you are all in my prayers.
