# "The Advent Wreath: Explained"

Well, it's that time of the year again, that time where we prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth and for the liturgical year to come. Much like Lent, Advent is a time of personal reflection, and what better way to reflect on the messages of Advent than the quintessential symbol of this liturgical season: the Advent Wreath! As you may already know, our very own Advent Wreath was graciously donated to the Church by members of the Hospitality Committee, and acts as a symbol of the various themes and lessons of Advent. Every part of the wreath is symbolic of some aspect of Advent, even including the wreath itself, which is said to symbolize the continuous, interconnected, and eternal life which God has shared with us through his Son. However, the majority of the Wreath's symbolisms lie within its four colorful candles. Each week, a candle is lit to remind us of one of **four** central themes.

While other traditions may have different meanings for each of their candles, the UCC celebrates the four candles of Hope, Peace, Love, and Joy. First comes Hope, symbolizing our anticipation of the coming Messiah, which was foretold to us through the prophets. During the week of Hope, we should reflect on our expectations of this coming year, and what expectations God has for each of us. Next comes the candle of Peace, that being the Peace of God's presence among us. During the week of Peace, we should reflect on what brings us Peace in our lives, and how we can achieve Peace through prayer and worship. On the third week, we celebrate the Love of Jesus Christ, who was born so that we could become vessels of His love to all. During the week of Love, we should reflect on how we can share the Love of Christ with all people, even those people with whom we disagree or have issues with. Finally, on the fourth week, we reflect on the message of Joy, that being the Joy of Christ's birth, and Joy of God's presence among us. During the week of Joy, we should remind ourselves of the joys that we have experienced in the past year and give thanks to God for his many gifts. While there is still so much more to say about the themes and symbolism of Advent, I hope that you enjoyed this brief overview of the season, and I hope that it can guide you in your own journey of reflection. Last but not least, I wish you all a Merry Christmas, and a Happy New Year!

### Outreach

Thanksgiving Food Drive. Our food drive was very successful again this year. We were able to fill 31 bags of food and we delivered 13 to the VNA and 18 to the Keefe Center. There was also extra food for our food bank containers. Thanks to all who contributed with food and monetary donations, and to the drivers and people who helped load the cars. I want to tell you from experience how important it is that we do this every year. For the last several years that I have dropped off food at Keefe, I am usually greeted with many people coming out to help unload my car. It's pretty crazy there with lots of drop offs going on at the same time. This year when I got there, there was already a line of about 20 people standing out in the cold with bags waiting to pick up food. That really got to me. Some of you know that there were some mishaps with the turkeys and that I had to scramble to find 3 more at the last minute. After all the frustration, it really put things in perspective when I saw the people in line. So just know that everything we do, no matter how much or how little does really help others!

Hamden Kids Holiday Toy Drive. Once again, the Keefe Center is collaborating with several Hamden Community Services to provide toys to over 500 children during the holiday. You may drop off your unwrapped toys at the Hamden Mart Parking Lot in front of Aldi's on the following Saturdays: Dec 3<sup>rd</sup>, Dec 10<sup>th</sup>, and Dec 17<sup>th</sup> from 10am-2pm. If you wish, place them on the stage and the Outreach Committee will deliver them. See the enclosed flyer for a list of suggestions.

# 14. Joseph the Carpenter Took Mary to Be His Wife

# Matthew 1:18-24 NIV

This is how the <u>birth</u> of Jesus <u>Christ</u> came about: His <u>mother</u> Mary was <u>pledged</u> to be <u>married</u> to <u>Joseph</u>, but <u>before</u> they <u>came</u> together, she was <u>found</u> to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her <u>husband</u> was a <u>righteous man</u> and did not want to <u>expose</u> her to <u>public disgrace</u>, he had in <u>mind</u> to <u>divorce</u> her <u>quietly</u>.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a <u>dream</u> and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be <u>afraid</u> to <u>take</u> Mary <u>home</u> as your <u>wife</u>, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will <u>save</u> his people from their sins."

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"—which means, "God with us."

When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.
