From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Church Family,

I am grateful to be starting this new season of shared ministry with you. I want to begin with thanks for the many ways you have made me feel welcome here, not the least of which is my newly painted office. Please stop by and see it during coffee hour if you did not get to do so last week. It is beautiful.

We are less than a month from the beginning of Lent, the church season that leads us to commemorate Jesus' death and celebrate his resurrection. Ash Wednesday is February 22. The popular conception of Lent is that we all have to give up something we love, as though deprivation is the central theme, but that misses the true value of the season.

The idea of giving things up comes from the ancient practice of fasting as a spiritual discipline, but it was more than just doing without food. Those who were fasting would pray during the time they normally ate; the point was one of focus and intentionality. And I am not sure the imagined that their practice would lead to our giving up Peanut M&Ms for a few weeks.

You may already have ways of being during Lent that feed and focus you and, if so, I hope you will share them. During our Lenten worship services, we will be trying some different things to give us a freshened sense of intentionality and, we hope, a fresh encounter with God's Spirit. We will send more information as the season nears.

One item to mark on your calendar now: Our Maundy Thursday service will be on April 6 at 5:30 pm. We are moving the service to an earlier time where those who don't want to drive at night can attend. It is one of my favorite services of the year. I hope you will plan to be there.

As I settle in and get a better sense of my schedule, I look forward to opportunities to get to know you personally. I have a church email account now. You can reach me at pastor@muccucc.org for whatever reason.

A Message from the Stewardship Committee

The Stewardship Campaign began with Stewardship Sunday on November 13th, 2022. The Stewardship Committee would like to thank everyone who has made a pledge commitment. Your current and past generosity and support of our congregation is greatly appreciated.
