A Reflection by Aren Alberico

I hope that you all had a happy Christmas and a wonderful New Year's celebration! As we enter into a new year, we enter into the liturgical season of Epiphany, a word which means "new understanding". During this time of year, after the hustle and bustle of the Christmas season (and all the stress that comes with it), I tend to remember this quote from the 1986 cult film *Ferris Bueller's Day Off:* "Life moves pretty fast. If you don't stop and look around once in a while, you could miss it". In today's world, we so often allow ourselves to be swept away from one event to the next, without giving ourselves the opportunity to look back and appreciate that which came before. But during this time of Epiphany, this time of "new understanding," we are reminded to take a moment to reflect on those past events with fresh eyes and a new perspective, and to find meaning in what we may have thought was mundane or meaningless. In last year's January reflection, Reverend Olivia would dub these specific points in time "aha moments", moments of grace-filled clarity where you think to yourself "Aha! So that's what that means".

With that in mind, let us look back at this past year of 2022, with all its struggles and all of its joys, with fresh and rejuvenated eyes. Let us take a moment to appreciate all that we may have missed in this past year, those times that we let pass without a care or thought. Let us take a moment to find meaning in those events both extraordinary and mundane, to learn new things from those times of strife and turmoil. Let us try to understand where we may have gone wrong, and where we may have gone right, so that we can apply those experiences to that which we do in the years to come. And finally, let us reflect on the good we did for others this past year, and what good we can do for others this year. Now that we have reflected on the past, let us look towards the future with this, a Holiday Wish shared with me this past month by Greta Edelman:

"May we break down boundaries, tear down walls, and build on the foundation of goodness inside each of us. May we look past differences, gain understanding, and embrace acceptance. May we reach out to each other, rather than resist. May we be better stewards of the earth, protecting, nurturing

and replenishing the beauties of nature. May we practice gratitude for all we have, rather than complain about our needs. May we seek cures for the sick, help for the hungry, and love for the lonely. May we share our talents, give our time, and teach our children. May we hold hope for the future very tenderly in our hearts and do all we can to build for bright tomorrows. 


