## **The Bell Tree** By Angela Paschall

What is a Bell Tree? Is it a tree that grows in the Amazon? Is it a type of tropical drink? Is it the latest self-driving car? Is it the new name of the Mount Carmel Congregational Church newsletter? Yes!

But do you know why this name was chosen?

As parishioners at Mount Carmel, we know many of things about our church home. We know we have a very long worship history dating back to Olde England; we know we have a desirable Hamden location which we have occupied for generations; and, we know we have a beautifully designed and preserved parish that is recognized in the National Registry of Historic Places.


But did you know that once upon a time, there stood a mighty tree on our property, a Sycamore, but not just any Sycamore. This one played a significant role in church history. It stood, just in front of and to the south of, the Greek Revival portico.

Historical records show that construction on our current church building was completed in 1840. Records also show that the bespoke church bell, ordered to take its place in the bell tower, arrived while the bell tower was yet unfinished.

According to \*Mrs. Rachael Hartley, church historian 1964, she wrote, “The bell was delivered before the steeple was finished; a church service was scheduled so Leverett and Philos Dickerman hoisted the bell into the tree and saw that it rung from its temporary and precarious position.”

Resourceful, don't you think?

Thus, the historic tree was dubbed The Bell Tree in recognition of providing a temporary home to the bell that still rings for Mount Carmel Congregational today.



If The Bell Tree could talk, it would tell tales of seeing parishioners arrive by horse and wagon. It would remember the excitement of the founding of the country and the debut of the Constitution and Bill of Rights. It would share the sadness of so many young people going off to so many wars--The Revolutionary War, The War of 1812, the Civil War, The Spanish American War, World War I, World War II, Korea, Vietnam, and Iraq--some never to return. It would remember when Hamden became a town, no longer just an area called The Blue Hills, a suburb of New Haven. And it could recall the celebrations of the church's 100th, 200th and 250th anniversaries!

In the fullness of time, a decision was made about The Bell Tree. It had to come down. It was damaged during a storm and--in order to protect the very building that it once served--the tree that predated the building, the town, the country had to come down.

The Bell Tree served the parish in many ways. It provided shade on a sunny day. It was a gathering spot. It put spectacular fiery foliage show as leaves turned colors every fall. And now it serves as an appropriate name---with a nod to the Dickerman brothers---for our newsletter.

The remnant of The Bell Tree stump is still visible--a wide and circular specimen of nature with its many, many rings--depicting the number of years it stood and served.

“We are, perhaps, blessed that this base was left behind as a reminder of the roots (literally) of Mount Carmel Congregational Church” says Interim Reverend Olivia Robinson. “We need to place a commemorative plaque here so that parishioners at the 300th anniversary and beyond can know The Bell Tree history. “




